PROFILE

Mrs Jabulile Sishuba is the Director for Programmes at Safer South Africa Foundation. She is a retired Chief Deputy Commissioner in the Department of Correctional Services (DCS).

Sishuba holds a BA(SW) from University of the North, BA (SS) Honours from UNISA, a Master's Degree in Social Sciences from UNISA and a Post Graduate Diploma in Community School Work from Canada and Early Childhood Education Canada.

She has worked in various fields of social work and as a part time lecturer in South Africa and Canada before joining the DCS in 1996. There she held various senior management positions including Acting National Commissioner before her retirement in 2007.

During her tenure in DCS she served in the National Task Team on Gender Equality; Social Crime Prevention; and was involved in the drafting of the White Paper on Corrections, and the United Nations Group of Experts on Restorative Justice. She also led projects such as the Special Remission of Sentences and the Offender Rehabilitation Path Project.

Post retirement, she served in the Department of Public Service and Administration on the project of the 6th Pan-African Ministers of Public/Civil Service in 2008. In the same year, she was appointed as the Managing Director of Riyabopa Training and Consulting Solutions, a position she held until joining the Deputy Minister of Correctional Services in 2009 as Head of Office.

She has served on various professional bodies, such as the Council for Social Workers, National Council for Correctional Services, The National Council for People with Disabilities and on the board of the National Electronic Media Institute of South Africa.
